



The Summary of Benefits and Coverage (SBC) document will help you choose a health plan. The SBC shows you how you and the plan would share the cost for covered health care services. NOTE: Information about the cost of this plan (called the premium) will be provided separately.

Important Questions	Answers	Why This Matters:
What is the overall <u>deductible</u> ?	In- <u>network</u> : \$5,000 individual / \$10,000 family per calendar year. Out-of- <u>network</u> : \$10,000 individual / \$20,000 family per calendar year.	Generally, you must pay all of the costs from <u>providers</u> up to the <u>deductible</u> amount before this <u>plan</u> begins to pay. If you have other family members on the <u>plan</u> , each family member must meet their own individual <u>deductible</u> until the total amount of <u>deductible</u> expenses paid by all family members meets the overall family <u>deductible</u> .
Are there services covered before you meet your <u>deductible</u> ?	Yes. Pediatric dental services, pediatric vision services and the following in- <u>network</u> services: <u>preventive care</u> and preferred generic drugs. <u>Copayments</u> and amounts in excess of the <u>allowed amount</u> do not count toward the <u>deductible</u> .	This <u>plan</u> covers some items and services even if you haven't yet met the <u>deductible</u> amount. But a <u>copayment</u> or <u>coinsurance</u> may apply. For example, this <u>plan</u> covers certain <u>preventive services</u> without <u>cost sharing</u> and before you meet your <u>deductible</u> . Are there other <u>deductibles</u> for specific services?	No.	You don't have to meet <u>deductibles</u> for specific services.
What is the <u>out-of-pocket limit</u> for this <u>plan</u> ?	In- <u>network</u> : \$7,350 individual / \$14,700 family per calendar year. Out-of- <u>network</u> : \$15,000 individual / \$30,000 family per calendar year.	The <u>out-of-pocket limit</u> is the most you could pay in a year for covered services. If you have other family members in this <u>plan</u> , they have to meet their own <u>out-of-pocket limits</u> until the overall family <u>out-of-pocket limit</u> has been met.

<p><b>What is not included in the <u>out-of-pocket limit</u>?</b></p>	<p><u>Premiums</u>, <u>balance-billed</u> charges, and health care this <u>plan</u> doesn't cover.</p>	<p>Even though you pay these expenses, they don't count toward the <u>out-of-pocket limit</u>.</p>
<p><b>Will you pay less if you use a <u>network provider</u>?</b></p>	<p>Yes. See <a href="https://asuris.com/go/Preferred">asuris.com/go/Preferred</a> or call 1 (888) 367-2109 for a list of <u>network providers</u>.</p>	<p>This <u>plan</u> uses a <u>provider network</u>. You will pay less if you use a <u>provider</u> in the <u>plan's network</u>. You will pay the most if you use an <u>out-of-network provider</u>, and you might receive a bill from a <u>provider</u> for the difference between the <u>provider's</u> charge and what your <u>plan</u> pays (<u>balance billing</u>). Be aware, your <u>network provider</u> might use an <u>out-of-network provider</u> for some services (such as lab work). Check with your <u>provider</u> before you get services.</p>
<p><b>Do you need a <u>referral</u> to see a <u>specialist</u>?</b></p>	<p>No.</p>	<p>You can see the <u>specialist</u> you choose without a <u>referral</u>.</p>

**Your Grievance and Appeals Rights:** There are agencies that can help if you have a complaint against your plan for a denial of a claim. This complaint is called a grievance or appeal. ### Does this plan provide Minimum Essential Coverage? Yes

If you don't have Minimum Essential Coverage for a month, you'll have to make a payment when you file your tax return unless you qualify for an exemption from the requirement that you have health coverage for that month.

### Does this plan meet the Minimum Value Standards? Yes

If your plan doesn't meet the Minimum Value Standards, you may be eligible for a premium tax credit to help you pay for a plan through the Marketplace.

About these Coverage Examples:



**This is not a cost estimator.** Treatments shown are just examples of how this plan might cover medical care. Your actual costs will be different depending on the actual care you receive, the prices your providers charge, and many other factors. Focus on the cost sharing amounts (deductibles, copayments and coinsurance) and excluded services under the plan. Use this information to compare the portion of costs you might pay under different health plans. Please note these coverage examples are based on self-only coverage.

**Peg is Having a Baby**  
(9 months of in-network pre-natal care and a hospital delivery)

- The plan's overall deductible \$5,000
- Specialist copayment \$40
- Hospital (facility) coinsurance 25%
- Other coinsurance 25%

Specialist office visits (*prenatal care*)  
Childbirth/Delivery Professional Services

(a year of routine in-network care of a well-controlled condition)

- The plan's overall deductible \$5,000
- Specialist copayment \$40
- Hospital (facility) coinsurance 25%
- Other coinsurance 25%

Primary care physician office visits (*including disease education*)  
Diagnostic tests (*blood work*)  
Prescription drugs  
Durable medical equipment (*glucose meter*)

<b>Total Example Cost</b>	<b>\$7,400</b>
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In this example, Joe would pay:

**Mia's Simple Fracture**  
(in-network emergency room visit and follow up care)

- The plan's overall deductible \$5,000
- Specialist copayment \$40
- Hospital (facility) coinsurance 25%

Emergency room care (*including medical supplies*)  
Diagnostic test (*x-ray*)  
Durable medical equipment (*crutches*)  
Rehabilitation services (*physical therapy*)
