Important Questions	Answers	Why This Matters:
<b>What is the overall deductible?</b>	<b>\$500</b> Individual / <b>\$1,000</b> Family	Generally, you must pay all of the costs from <u>providers</u> up to the <u>deductible</u> amount before this <u>plan</u> begins to pay. If you have other Family members on the <u>plan</u> , each Family member must meet their own Individual <u>deductible</u> until the total amount of <u>deductible</u> expenses paid by all Family members meets the overall Family <u>deductible</u> .
<b>Are there services covered before you meet your deductible?</b>	<b>Yes.</b> <u>Preventive care</u> and services indicated in chart starting on page 2.	This <u>plan</u> covers some items and services even if you haven't yet met the <u>deductible</u> amount. But a <u>copayment</u> or <u>coinsurance</u> may apply. For example, this <u>plan</u> covers certain <u>preventive services</u> without <u>cost-sharing</u> and before you meet your <u>deductible</u> . <b>Are there other deductibles for specific services?</b>	<b>No.</b>	You don't have to meet <u>deductibles</u> for specific services.
<b>What is the out-of-pocket limit for this plan?</b>	<b>\$4,500</b> Individual / <b>\$9,000</b> Family	The <u>out-of-pocket limit</u> is the most you could pay in a year for covered services. If you have other Family members in this <u>plan</u> , they have to meet their own <u>out-of-pocket</u> limits until the overall Family <u>out-of-pocket</u> limit has been met.
<b>What is not included in the out-of-pocket limit?</b>	<u>Premiums</u> , <u>balance-billing</u> charges, health care this <u>plan</u> doesn't cover and services indicated in chart starting on page 2.	Even though you pay these expenses, they don't count toward the <u>out-of-pocket limit</u> .
<b>Will you pay less if you use a network provider?</b>	<b>Yes.</b> See <a href="http://www.kp.org/wa">www.kp.org/wa</a> or call 1-888-901-4636 (TTY: 711) for a list of <u>network providers</u> .	This <u>plan</u> uses a <u>provider network</u> . You will pay less if you use a <u>provider</u> in the plan's <u>network</u> . You will pay the most if you use an <u>out-of-network provider</u> , and you might receive a bill from a <u>provider</u> for the difference between the <u>provider's</u> charge and what your <u>plan</u> pays ( <u>balance billing</u> ). Be aware, your <u>network provider</u> might use an <u>out-of-network provider</u> for some services (such as lab work). Check with your <u>provider</u> before you get services.
<b>Do you need a referral to see a specialist?</b>	<b>Yes</b> , but you may self-refer to certain <u>specialists</u> .	This <u>plan</u> will pay some or all of the costs to see a <u>specialist</u> for covered services but only if you have a <u>referral</u> before you see the <u>specialist</u> .

**Does this plan provide Minimum Essential Coverage? Yes**

If you don’t have Minimum Essential Coverage for a month, you’ll have to make a payment when you file your tax return unless you qualify for an exemption from the requirement that you have health coverage for that month.

**Does this plan meet the Minimum Value Standards? Yes**

If your plan doesn’t meet the Minimum Value Standards, you may be eligible for a premium tax credit to help you pay for a plan through the Marketplace.

**This is not a cost estimator.** Treatments shown are just examples of how this plan might cover medical care. Your actual costs will be different depending on the actual care you receive, the prices your providers charge, and many other factors. Focus on the cost sharing amounts (deductibles, copayments and coinsurance) and excluded services under the plan. Use this information to compare the portion of costs you might pay under different health plans. Please note these coverage examples are based on self-only coverage.

### Peg is Having a Baby
